Year 1:

This week in Year 1, the children have been learning to identify different parts of animals. They were especially excited to use magnifying glasses to examine the features of a fish. The children confidently used vocabulary such as fin, scales, gills, and tail.

Year 2:

In Year 2, the children have been learning how to compare two-digit numbers. Using digit cards, they have been creating different numbers and practising how to say which number is 'greater than' or 'less than' another.

This activity helped them understand number value and build their confidence in maths. It has been great to see them apply these new skills independently!

- **Social and Emotional Development:** School is not just about academics it is also where children develop vital social skills, build friendships, and create lasting memories. Regular attendance helps children feel connected and engaged with their school family.
- Safeguarding: Regular attendance is also a key part of our safeguarding procedures. If
 a child is absent frequently, we may need to investigate to ensure there are no
 underlying concerns. The safety and wellbeing of all our children is always our number
 one priority.

Working Together to Support Attendance:

We are here to support every family in ensuring that children attend school regularly. If you are facing difficulties that might be affecting your child's attendance, please feel free to speak with your child's class teacher or Miss Franklin our Family Support Worker. Key Events - Autumn Term 2025



On **Monday 6th October**, we will be celebrating our Harvest Festival in school. This is a time for us to come together in thankfulness and to reflect on the importance of sharing with others. Arbor Pay / Parent Pay



We are delighted to share that the school is now using Arbor Parent Pay, a new system designed to make payments for trips and school services simpler and more convenient for families.

The first event set up through Arbor Parent Pay is the Autumn visit to the Pantomime, which will be managed and paid for via this platform. If you are experiencing any difficulties accessing Arbor Parent Pay, please speak to the school office, where members of staff will be happy to assist you.

As we begin to roll out this platform, you will notice further features appearing on your Arbor app. For example, in the near future, you will be able to book and make payments for Breakfast Club and After School Club directly through the system.

Please note that you will be unable to book onto these services if there is an outstanding balance on your account. We therefore kindly encourage families to ensure balances are kept up to date.

Safeguarding Spotlight: Everyday Safeguarding — What Parents Can Do

What Does "Everyday Safeguarding" Mean?

It means being aware of small, everyday actions that help keep all children safe, emotionally and physically — both in and out of school. These aren't always dramatic – they are the quiet, caring routines that help children feel secure and protected.

How You Can Help – Practical Actions for Parents:

Safe Drop-Off and Collection

- Always inform the school if someone new is picking up your child.
- Use any official password systems the school has in place.
- Be punctual children feel safer when routines are consistent.

Parent Tip: If your usual plans change, call the office — never rely on telling your child to pass on the message.

Talk to Your Child About Their Day

- · Ask open-ended questions like:
 - "What was something fun that happened today?"
 - "Did anything make you feel upset or confused?"
- Encourage them to name the adults they trust at school.

Parent Tip: Make these chats part of your bedtime or dinnertime routine.
