Communication and Language:

We will continue to strengthen language and communication skills by:

- Encouraging children to speak in full sentences and express their ideas clearly.
- Engaging in discussions about stories, experiences, and topics of interest.
- Extending vocabulary through themed activities, storytelling, and role-play.
- Following and giving instructions to develop listening and comprehension skills.



Physical Development:

To develop strength, coordination, and control, children will:

- Take part in sports activities, obstacle courses, and games to improve balance and agility.
- Practise fine motor skills through activities such as cutting, threading, and pencil control.
- Develop handwriting skills by refining letter formation



Personal Social and Emotional Development

This term, children will build confidence and resilience through:

- Developing independence in managing their belongings and daily routines.
- Learning to work cooperatively, share ideas, and solve problems with peers.
- Talking about their feelings and understanding how to manage emotions positively.
- Preparing for the transition to Year 1 by discussing changes and visiting new classrooms

Literacy:

Reading and writing skills will continue to develop through:


- Daily phonics sessions focusing on blending sounds for reading and segmenting for writing.
- Reading books with increasing fluency and comprehension.
- Writing simple sentences, using capital letters, finger spaces, and full stops.
- Retelling familiar stories and creating their own narratives.
- Exploring different types of writing



Mathematics:

We will consolidate mathematical understanding by:

- Recognising and using numbers to 10 and beyond with confidence.
- Exploring addition, subtraction, doubling, halving, and sharing.
- Recognising and creating patterns, sequences, and number bonds.
- Comparing and measuring height, weight and capacity.



Understanding the World:

Children will deepen their understanding of the world by:

- Observing seasonal changes and learning about summer.
- Exploring habitats, lifecycles, and growth through hands-on nature experiences.
- Discussing different places, cultures, and traditions around the world.
- Learning about different jobs and roles in the community.
- Using technology to support learning and explore different ways to present ideas.
