
### WHO WE ARE

### OUR CURRICULUM



At Blackmoor Park, we are proud to follow the Early Years (EYFS) Curriculum and Lunar Curriculum developed by the **Three Saints Academy Trust**. This innovative curriculum is designed to engage and inspire our young learners, building their knowledge and skills in a deep and meaningful way.

The **Early Years Curriculum** focuses on providing a nurturing, play-based learning environment guided by the Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) framework. It covers seven key areas of learning, including personal, social, emotional development, communication, physical development, literacy, mathematics, understanding the world, and expressive arts and design. The curriculum fosters creativity, curiosity, and independence while promoting confidence and resilience.

Through thematic exploration and hands-on activities, children are encouraged to develop a love of learning. We work closely with parents and carers, ensuring a strong partnership to support each child's growth and development, both academically and socially.

#### What is the Lunar Curriculum?



## SCHOOL ADMISSIONS



Blackmoor Park Infant School and Kindergarten follow the Liverpool City Council admissions process, meaning parents should apply through the council's system.

#### Liverpool City Council Primary School Admissions: A Guide for Prospective Parents

Liverpool City Council manages the admissions process for Reception places in primary schools, ensuring a fair and straightforward system. Here's what parents need to know:

#### 1. Key Dates & Application Process

- Applications open in September and close in mid-January for children starting school the following September.
- Late applications may reduce the chances of securing a preferred school.

#### 2. How to Apply

- Applications must be submitted online via the Liverpool City Council website.
- Parents can list multiple school preferences (usually up to three).
- Places are allocated based on admission criteria, which may include distance from the school, sibling attendance, and special educational needs.

#### 3. School Offers & Appeals

- Offer letters are sent out in April.
- If a child is not offered a preferred school, parents can appeal through an independent panel.

#### 4. Additional Considerations

- Faith Schools & Academies: May have additional entry requirements.
- Special Educational Needs (SEN): Parents should contact the Liverpool SEN Team for support.
- Moving to Liverpool? Applications can be submitted throughout the year, but places depend on availability.

# TRANSITION TO BLACKMOOR PARK JUNIORS



To ensure a smooth and confident transition, we place great emphasis on providing both academic and emotional continuity for each child. Teachers from both Blackmoor Park Infants and Juniors work closely together, sharing detailed information about each child's progress, learning style, and any additional support they may require. This close collaboration helps to maintain a consistent approach to teaching, ensuring that children feel secure and well-prepared for the next stage of their education.

As children move into the Junior School, they will encounter new expectations and opportunities. To support the children during this transition, we organise various induction activities, including welcome sessions, guided tours of the Junior School, and introductions to new teachers and friends. These activities are designed to make the children feel at home in their new environment, fostering a sense of excitement and anticipation for the next chapter in their school life.

Parents are an integral part of this process, and we ensure that they are kept well-informed every step of the way. This partnership between school and home is essential in supporting children as they settle into their new school.

# EXTENDED SERVICES



At Blackmoor Park Infants, we understand the needs of busy families and are proud to offer a range of extended services to support both children and parents. Our Breakfast Club, Afterschool Club, and Holiday Club provide a safe, welcoming environment where children can learn, play, and relax beyond the school day.

#### Breakfast and After School Club

Breakfast Club opens from **7:45am** each morning, giving children a calm and positive start to their day with a healthy breakfast and fun activities before lessons begin. Our Afterschool Club runs until **5:55pm**, offering a wide range of engaging activities including arts and crafts, games, outdoor play, and quiet time for reading or home learning activities.

#### **Breakfast Club:**

£4.50 per regular session (£5.00 irregular sessions)

#### **After School Club:**

£9.00 per regular session (£11.50 irregular sessions)

#### Holiday Club

During school holidays, our Holiday Club provides childcare and entertainment in a familiar setting, with themed days, creative projects, and plenty of active play. We charge £18 per half day session (either am or pm) or £24 for the full day. During Holiday Club, one day is designated for an external trip. There is an additional £18 cost to cover transport and admission to attractions.

All our extended services are run by experienced staff who know our children well, ensuring continuity of care and a nurturing atmosphere at all times.









## OUR DAY NURSERY



Our Day Nursery offers high-quality early years education and care for children throughout the year, operating 52 weeks annually to support families with flexible childcare needs. We are proud to offer both 15-hour and 30-hour funded places, making early learning accessible to all eligible families.

Our Day Nursery is an integral part of our school community and is overseen by our dedicated School Committee. As part of The Three Saints Academy Trust, we are committed to delivering a nurturing, stimulating environment where children can thrive and develop a lifelong love of learning.

Located within the West Derby Children's Centre building, our nursery benefits from purpose-built facilities designed specifically for young children. Our experienced and caring staff team works closely with families to provide a safe, supportive, and inclusive setting for every child.

Our O-3 provision works closely with practitioners in the Kindi (3+) provision to ensure a smooth and supportive transition as children move through the early years stages. This collaborative approach ensures continuity of care and learning, with a strong focus on school readiness as children prepare for Reception.

Although the Day Nursery is part of the school, it is separately registered on the Early Years Register and receives its own Ofsted inspection. We are proud to share that the nursery is currently rated 'Good' in all areas by Ofsted, reflecting the high standards of care, learning, and development we provide.

# VISITS AND ENRICHMENT OPPORTUNITIES



At Blackmoor Park Infant School and Kindergarten, we value the importance of learning beyond the classroom. Educational visits and enrichment experiences are carefully planned to enhance the curriculum, develop children's understanding of the world, and create lasting memories.

Children in our Kindi (3+) provision will begin to explore their local community through a series of short visits, including a trip to the local café and an exciting day at Knowsley Safari Park.

In Reception, pupils will join Years 1 and 2 for a whole-school visit to the theatre to enjoy a traditional pantomime performance – a wonderful shared cultural experience.

Throughout the academic year, our enrichment programme offers children a range of subject-linked visits:


- During Science Week, Year 1 will visit Imagine That! and Year 2 will explore Eureka! on the Wirral.
- As part of their history topic, Year 1 will finish their topic of the 1960s with a visit to The Beatles Museum.
- Year 2 will conclude their time at Blackmoor with a memorable residential at Delamere / Foxhowl and the Conwy Centre.
