KINDI 3+



At Blackmoor Park Infant School and Kindergarten, we are proud to offer a rich and engaging curriculum that extends beyond the classroom. We are committed to providing all of our children with high-quality enrichment experiences, including memorable trips and visits that broaden their horizons, deepen their understanding, and spark a lifelong love of learning.

Enrichment in Kindi 3+

In Kindi 3+, our youngest children begin to explore the world around them through meaningful, first-hand experiences. During the year, they will have the opportunity to visit places in the local community, helping them to understand their place in it and develop a sense of belonging. These experiences support their learning and promote curiosity and confidence.

A highlight of the Kindi 3+ year is a visit to the safari park, where the children can observe and learn about animals from around the world—an exciting opportunity that links closely to their learning in school. Throughout the year, a variety of visitors come into school to enhance the children's learning, including members of the community, storytellers, and other professionals who help bring the curriculum to life.



RECEPTION



In Reception, children build on these early experiences with a programme of carefully planned enrichment activities designed to complement their learning across the curriculum. In December, they will attend the whole-school pantomime alongside Key Stage 1 - a festive tradition which introduces children to live performance in a fun and engaging way.

Later in the academic year, children take part in a visit to Chester Zoo during Science Week, enriching their understanding of animals, habitats, and the natural world. In the summer term, they will enjoy a hands-on pond dipping experience at Martin Mere, giving them the chance to explore wildlife in its natural habitat and develop their understanding of ecosystems.

In addition to these key visits, we continue to welcome a variety of visitors into school throughout the year to support and extend the children's learning in exciting and meaningful ways.

At Blackmoor Park Infant School and Kindergarten, we are committed to offering a wide range of high-quality enrichment opportunities. These experiences are carefully designed to inspire, challenge, and engage all of our children, helping them to develop a deeper understanding of the world and a strong foundation for future learning.



YEAR 1



As children progress into Year 1, they continue to benefit from a wide range of enrichment experiences that support and enhance their learning across the curriculum. They will once again take part in the whole-school visit to the pantomime in December - a much-anticipated event that brings the joy of live theatre to life and is a highlight of the Christmas season.

As part of their science learning, Year 1 children will enjoy a visit to Imagine That! Science and Discovery Centre. This hands-on, interactive experience allows children to explore a wide range of scientific concepts through play, investigation, and practical activities - fostering curiosity, creativity, and critical thinking in a fun and inspiring environment.

Later in the academic year, children will take part in a memorable visit to The Beatles Story museum in Liverpool, as part of their history topic on the 1960s and The Beatles. This exciting trip enables children to explore an important part of local and national history, helping them to understand the cultural impact of the era and the legacy of one of the world's most influential bands.

These experiences, alongside regular visitors to school throughout the year, support our commitment to providing a broad and engaging curriculum. YEAR 2



In Year 2, children continue to benefit from a rich and varied programme of enrichment experiences that enhance their learning and support their personal development. They will once again join the rest of the school for a pantomime visit in December - an exciting festive tradition that introduces children to live theatre in a fun and engaging way.


As part of their science curriculum, pupils will visit Eureka! The National Children's Museum, where they can explore scientific ideas through interactive exhibits and hands-on discovery. This visit encourages curiosity, investigation, and a real sense of wonder about how the world works.

A particular highlight of the Year 2 experience is the residential trip to Delamere Forest, where children stay at the Conway Centre: Foxhowl. This overnight stay offers a unique opportunity for children to develop independence, resilience, and teamwork, all while enjoying outdoor learning in a beautiful natural setting. Activities during the residential are carefully designed to build confidence, promote collaboration, and create lasting memories.
